- 5. Designate and maintain with the North Carolina Credit Union Division a North Carolina registered agent for service of process

The conditions under which a foreign credit union may conduct business in North Carolina are set forth in North Carolina General Statutes § 54-109.106 (2024).

The North Carolina Credit Union Division reserves the right to request additional documentation and information from the requesting credit union.
